SYLLABUS ACT Prep 1st, 2nd, and 4th Block 2021-2022

Goal: At the end of this course, students will show proficiency in standards related to ACT content.

Needs and Resources

Required Materials

To complete this course, students will need the following:

- A calculator capable of performing graphing functions, trigonometric functions and geometric functions. (Chromebooks may be used for graphing utilities.) (Note: Cell phones will not be allowed to be used as calculators.)

Student grades will be calculated using a running average for the year. Students will be given Major and Minor assignments. Major assignments will count for 60% of the final grade while minor assignments will accumulate to 40% of the final grade.
