Highlights from the Board Meeting of May 29, 2012

Consent Items

Enclosure A - CNP Applications and Meal Prices

- CNP Lunch/Breakfast Application and Policy Statement for 2012-13
- USDA Free and Reduced-Price Meals Application for 2012-13
- Lunch prices will increase by 15 cents for students due to the weighted average price requirement mandated by the federal government. Employee prices will increase by 25 cents and visitor prices will remain the same for breakfast and lunch.
- Prices will be as follows:
 - Breakfast – all schools - \$1.00
 - Lunch – West Elementary and Russellville Elementary - \$1.75
 - Lunch – Russellville Middle and Russellville High School - \$2.00
 - Reduced price for breakfast - \$.30
 - Reduced price for lunch - \$.40
 - Employee Lunch - \$2.50
 - Employee Breakfast - \$1.25
 - Visitor Breakfast - \$1.50
 - Visitor Lunch – \$4.00
